- Strength of the title
- The formal rules in visual art - space, line, shape, color, and effective use of light
  - Mastery of the chosen media
  - Presentation
- Communication of expression, emotion, boldness, uniqueness - qualities which caused me to want to take a closer look

I view the job of judging art as a way to celebrate excellence in artmaking. To all who entered their art in the show, I congratulate you for showing us what represented your best efforts - in work where you pushed a little harder, dug down a little deeper and came up with work that was uniquely yours.
