JUROR STATEMENT

Let me start by saying I truly enjoyed judging this exhibition. The Figure of Speech theme presented some unusual challenges and unexpected rewards as I worked my way through the selection process. While some of the titles and accompanying works were easily identifiable, others I had to step back and take a much more objective view of what the artist was trying to convey. Getting inside the head of an artist is not always the easiest, or probably safest, thing to do.

As I was reviewing the artwork entries and mulling over the titles, it reminded me that figures of speech, catch phrases, hyperbole, and metaphors play an influential role in our everyday communications. I couldn't help thinking about current world events - political, societal, the pandemic, and reflecting on how the turn of a phrase and images shape our public discourse. Coincidentally, this exhibit coincides with a display at the Indiana State Museum featuring public murals that were created by artists and business owners in response to George Floyd's death and the protests that followed. Both exhibits remind me of the power of an image and the artist's role in expressing, visually, ideas or emotions that can be difficult to put into words.

In jurying the exhibit and presenting awards, my criteria was quality of execution and the accuracy of the image to the chosen figure of speech. I'll confess that after I made my selections, I shared the images with my wife and daughter to get their reactions – not to influence my decision, but to hear their thoughts and have them enjoy the work. It's interesting, and informative to see how an image can garner different interpretations and spark conversations. In *Figures of Speech*, I believe the artists have given us a wonderful visual experience, and equally important, something to think about.

ABOUT THE JUDGE

Mark Ruschman is Senior Curator of Art and Culture at the Indiana State Museum and Historic Sites. His responsibilities include managing the ISMHS fine art collection, curating fine art exhibitions at the museum and historic sites, facilitating art acquisitions for the permanent collection, and traveling the state as a guest lecturer.

Ruschman earned his BA in art education from Indiana University in 1982. He was owner and director of Ruschman Art Gallery in downtown Indianapolis from 1984 until 2009. His nonprofit work includes positions with Indianapolis Downtown Artists and Dealers Association (IDADA), Indianapolis Museum of Contemporary Art (iMOCA), and Riley Area Development Corporation. His professional honors include the 2017 Creative Catalyst Award given by the Arts Council of Indianapolis, 2006 NUVO Cultural Vision Award recipient as President of IDADA, and the 2003 Bob Beckman award winner for service to Riley Area Development Corporation.
